## Reflections from Rev. Sue

Dear Grace Community,

Happy Advent! I hope your Thanksgiving was all you had hoped it would be and that you have had an opportunity to reflect on the many things for which you are thankful.

It's quite convenient, actually, that Thanksgiving is placed where it is in the calendar and liturgical year. In a way it can put us in the posture of preparing for the One who comes to us as God Incarnate.

Each week of Advent focuses on a different theme. They are, in order, Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love with the Sunday readings reflecting each theme. The Lapeer Ministerial Association is also using these themes for our Wednesday Advent evenings where we share soup and a program/liturgy. The first was this past Wednesday and hopefully you had the chance to attend at First Presbyterian Church. November 30<sup>th</sup> will be here at Grace; December 7<sup>th</sup> will be at St. Matthew's; and December 14<sup>th</sup> will be at Immaculate Conception (with

me preaching). Soup begins at 6pm with the liturgy at 7pm.

One of my favorite ways to prepare myself for the coming of the Christ child is the Advent calendar, which I've used almost every year of my life! It has a picture of some scene having to do with Christmas and there are "windows" to be opened each day of December through the 24<sup>th</sup> or 25<sup>th</sup>. Some Advent calendars have pictures when you open the window while others have scripture passages and still others have both. It's fun to discover each new picture/scripture as the days move on toward Christmas.

Similarly is the Jesse Tree which is made up of symbols representing Jesus' ancestors. The name, Jesse Tree, comes from Isaiah 11:1, in which Jesus is referred to as a shoot coming up from the stump of Jesse, the father of David. Making your own Jesse Tree could be a wonderful way to get ready spiritually for celebrating Jesus' birth.

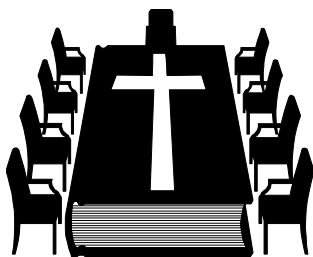
Another wonderful way to prepare for Christmas this Advent is to pray the daily

office. What I mean by that is to pray in the comfort of your own home each day any of the following: Morning Prayer (page 75); Evening Prayer (page 115); or Compline (page 127) service. The lectionary in the back of the Book of Common Prayer (see page 937 for Year Two) will tell you which Bible passages to read for each day. The Book of Common Prayer also contains Daily Devotions for Individuals and Families beginning on page 136 which are short and can include any of the daily readings.

I encourage you to take some intentional time to allow yourself and your spirit to prepare for the receiving of the Christ child.

Meeting opened at 6:30 with prayer by Clyde.

Brian Hurst of Edward Jones gave us a handout and explained how people can gift stocks and save on personal taxes.

Minutes for October-- Motion to approve, seconded. Voted on, *passed*.

**Old Business**--Stewardship update was given on a sheet, some changes but still below what is needed. Statue update-no news, still haven't heard back on the value, insurance will cover, Abi had a picture and article when it was dedicated, Lori is on the trail. Grant update--The committee has met, Dave Webster is the head, Nancy is our contact person. Hope to have something for us at December meeting. Think about having kids like the football players move the pews out. Adventure club update--Steve Bagadinski is filling out the paper work.

**New Business**--Nancy spoke about the possibility of using silk flowers as real are getting expensive. We can get 4 seasonal arrangements for 2 vases , people could have real flowers or pay \$25 to use silk with the church general fund getting the benefit . Two family parishioners offered to donate the 2 sets of seasonal arrangements. A motion to go ahead with this idea, support . Voted on, *passed*. Rev. Sue will advise the worship committee. Next vestry meeting conflicts with Advent soup supper, changed to Dec 7 at 7:30. Lauraine informed us that Food for Families will participate in the Walk for Warmth soup cook-off on Nov. 18 with Doc's seafood chowder. Also Janie called and she and Dutch appreciated the gift but want to turn it back to FFF and have bought some ground beef for us. Rev. Sue reported on Kathy's work and that she should get extra pay for special events cleanup. We will ask Lori what that rate should be (check past fees) for half day and full day, also get input from Kathy. It is a diocesan thing that she gets paid vacation. We need to arrange a replacement when she is on vacation. We received a letter from the diocesan chancellor regarding cribs. Dick will fix it so the side no longer drops. There is a man coming tomorrow for a safety walk through and he will ask him about it.

**Financial Report**--There was a question on the \$8,000 or \$5,000 discrepancy of total. No final budget yet for 2012, should see it next month. Dick moved to accept the report, Harold supported. Accepted.

**Priest's Comments**--Rev. Sue thinking of time management. She had a 45 minute phone session with Will Thompson, an Episcopal priest who coaches clergy in this. She is asking Grace to cover one fourth of the cost and gave us a sheet of information. Harold asked if she'd tried anything else. Dryden vestry meets next Tuesday and she needs to talk to the Bishop. We want to check him out and learn more about this before deciding. She will email us after talking to the Bishop and Dryden. Donna Aukett is in McLaren Flint and hoping to get to Lapeer transitional care. Abi Warner was in the hospital, Twila Mercer is recovering at home. Clyde added Nancy's mother moved to Suncrest today. Rev. Sue would like to start a book study in January with Unbinding Your Church. We need to let her know if we want to be part of it. She needs 6 from Grace and 4 from St. John's.

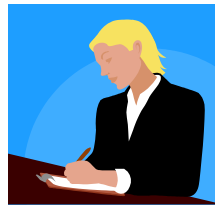
Meeting ended at 8:35 with prayer by Nancy.

# SENIOR WARDEN Report


Yea! We won the Soup Cook Off. Thanks to Doc for his wonderful recipe and everyone who pitched in to help with preparation and serving.

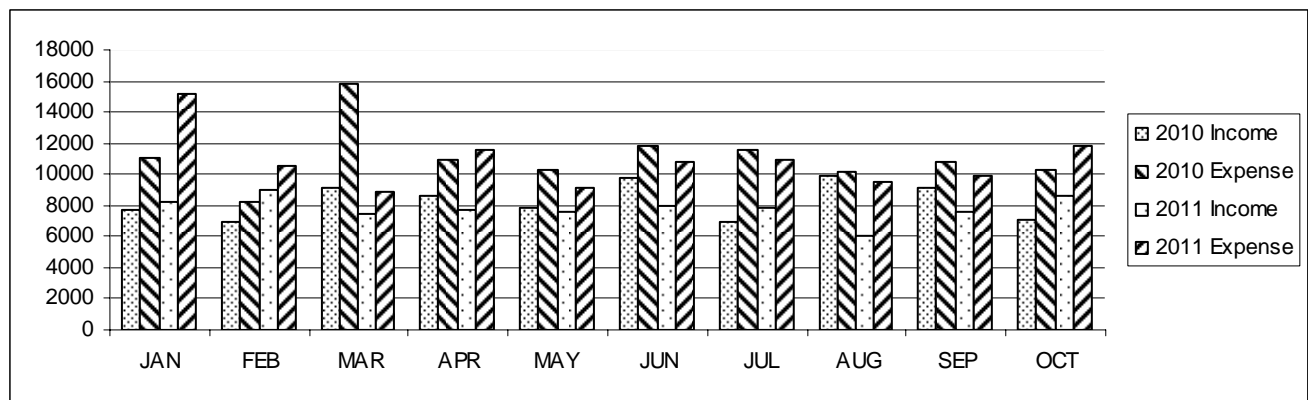

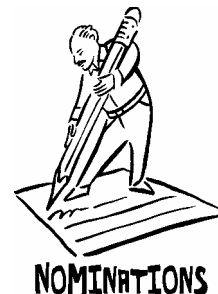
Poinsettias will again be available for \$10 each. Call Lori at the office for more information. Deadline is December 11th.

## FLINT RIVER VALLEY CONVOCATION

November 12, 2011, Held at St. John's, Dryden

Jon Steele called the meeting to order at 9:06 with opening prayer.

Scripture reading – Sherry Boyden followed by discussion.

Agenda – Motion to approve by Frank and supported by Dennis. Approved.

Minutes – Motion to approve by Frank, supported by Jack. Approved.

### President's Report:

A couple of changes from convention: Four dates a year will be reserved for confirmations at a central location.

The Diocese will be hiring a communications expert to get news out to a wider audience about the Episcopal Church. We are responsible for the next convention which we estimate will cost approximately \$3000

No decisions on grants will be made until after Summit at which time we should be better informed about changes and available \$.

### Old Business:

Christian Service Awards will be awarded to Barb Taylor of St. Dunstan's, Norb Birchmeier of Trinity, and Carolyn Koenig of Christ Church. The tentative award schedule is Dec 11<sup>th</sup> at 10, Dec 18<sup>th</sup> at 10, and Dec 4 at 9:30, resp.

Our Dec 10<sup>th</sup> meeting will be at St. Paul's, Flint and Jan 14<sup>th</sup> at St. Andrew's, Flint.

### New Business:

- Special Guest: John Snell from St. Paul's, Flint was present to speak on the changes at C.E.C. a non-profit 5013 organization. They have terminated the former board in order facilitate change and move forward. The new board of directors is very positive. They are planning a newsletter to parishes and would like an opportunity to speak at parish coffee hours. They are in the process of finding a new executive director (a paid position needed to qualify for some of their funding), and will take recommendations (experience with non-profit org. and with eastern Flint).

Convocation Summit: Nov 19<sup>th</sup>, 10:00 to 3:00, at St. John's, Midland. Clergy are encouraged to attend and others are welcome.

### Parish Updates:

St. Christopher's – Grand Blanc: FISH pancake breakfast is later this month. Tomorrow we are hosting a breakfast and lunch for the youth of the parish. Outreach committee is being revamped. Christmas tree for helping needy families is being set up. Great music programs

St. Dunstan's – Davison: Last Saturday was Memorial Vigil – read over 6000 names with special prayers every hour. Dec 4<sup>th</sup> is Senior Dinner for residents of Sr. Housing Program. December 12<sup>th</sup> is women's Christmas Party. An eagle scout is heading up the painting of the church including moving pews to paint the floor.

St. Andrew's – Flint: Our Friday, Saturday, and Sunday food program continues with some high school student volunteers for the summer. Bishop Todd's visit was October 30<sup>th</sup> – 14 were confirmed. The day included a Halloween party for the kids with a great turn out.

Trinity – Flushing: Just had our Progressive Dinner – 26 involved. We set up a booth for Flushing Harvest Fest which was successful. Wednesday is Bible Study. We'll be setting up a Christmas tree to help with gifts for the needy. Our Christmas wreath sale is coming up.

St. John's – Otter Lake: Our food distribution program with other churches in the area served 46 families (up from 36 last month). We started a healing service – the next one is Thursday. We have an organist for the first time in years. Nazarene Church used our hall to run a Spaghetti Dinner which was very successful. Fall Fest is Nov 19<sup>th</sup> and Ecumenical gathering is Nov 20<sup>th</sup>. Dec 16<sup>th</sup> is the parish Christmas Party.

St. Jude's – Fenton: Bishop Todd's visit was last week – several confirmations and good crowd. Outreach is meeting with Presbyterian Church to join forces. Progressive Dinner was October. Script program has been successful.

## Flint River Valley Convocation Meeting Con't.

St. Paul's – Flint: Held C.E.C. silent auction and dinner which made \$4000. We now have a choir director and organist. Our building is being used for children's grief counseling. Harvest Dinner is Nov 20<sup>th</sup> during coffee hour. Dec 15<sup>th</sup> is parish Christmas Party.

Christ Church – Owosso: Annual Harvest Dinner served 109 people. This week-end is Veteran's Day celebration, Commander of Civil Air Patrol will speak, and we'll have presentation of colors led by bagpipes. We are negotiating with Rev. Les Harding for another year.

St. John's – Dryden: Karen Cisco, our new organist, is doing well as is the choir. Becky Foster is head of music series which featured a blue grass group at the end of October.

Grace Church – Lapeer: Last weekend was our fall bazaar/raffle/dinner which netted a good profit. The choir is starting practice for Christmas. We're keeping up with the food bank.

Treasurer's Report:

- Bills are paid through Nov., and add \$2300 to bottom line due to sale of St. John's, St. John's assets.
- We anticipate a balance of \$12,000 at end of year, have received grant requests totaling about \$38,000, and are not sure what we will receive from the diocese.

Motion to approve by Doris, supported by Frank. Approved.

Dean's Report:

- This is the Very Rev. Dr. Jay Gant's second stint as Convocation Dean, and very excited about changes that are occurring.
- Encourages as many people as possible to attend Summit. Determination of available funds for convocations will be made at the Summit.

The primary goal of the Episcopal Church is the carry the message of Jesus' presence. How are we accomplishing this and offering others the chance to give back or help?

Keep in prayer: Judy Coller and family.

Motion was made to adjourn by Anne and supported by Jack.

This month we have served 310 meals of baked chicken, fried chicken, baked rigatoni, and beef over noodles with salads, vegetables, and desserts.

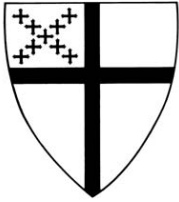
