## A note from Rev. Sue

Dear Grace Community,

It is with great pleasure that I am writing this letter to you as we begin our life of ministry together. I am grateful for the faithful presence and ministry that Bill Boli has shared with you these last two years and pray that I may continue to be a positive priestly influence. I also want to share publicly my appreciation for Judy Downey, senior warden, Dick West, junior warden and the whole vestry for their diligence and care for Grace and for welcoming me so generously.

There are many questions about how we will share life and ministry so let me begin by sharing some of the nuts and bolts of scheduling. As you may know, I will be about half time at Grace as I remain on at St. John's, Dryden also about half time. I will continue to serve as Missioner to the Mutual Ministry Support Teams at St. Paul's, Corunna and St. John the Baptist, Otter Lake. (This means I meet with the teams once a month and visit Sunday worship and meet with each vestry twice a year.) I will also continue teaching the liturgy course at the Coppage-Gordon School for Ministry once a month (which will now be on Saturday evenings).

Thanks to Bishop Todd and

his gift of out-of-the-box thinking, a solution to provide a priestly/sacramental presence has been revealed. Four sacramentalists (priests) (two each) from the two Mutual Ministry Support Teams will be rotating between their own churches, Grace and St. John's. Russ Merrill and Nancy Steele from St. Paul's, Corunna and Ann Norton and Sarah Parks from St. John the Baptist are the names of the four sacramentalists. With that in mind here's what a typical month will look like.

On the 1st and 3rd Sundays a sacramentalist will be at Grace (while I preside at St. John's). On the 2nd and 4th Sundays I will be at Grace (while a sacramentalist will be at St. John's). On the 5th Sundays a sacramentalist will be at Grace (and St. John's while I visit one of the Mutual Ministry Support Team churches). Later in this newsletter you will find a chart that has been created which contains our initial plans for which of the five of us will be where on Sunday mornings.

During the week I will have office hours at Grace on Wednesdays. Monday will be my office day at St. John's, Tuesday will be a day I attend meetings, make visits and generally be available. Thursday is my study day and Friday is my sabbath day. I

will be available as needed on Saturday.

This being said I want you to know that I am accessible should you need to speak with or make an appointment to see me. Feel free to call me at St. John's on Mondays (810-796-2371) or on my cell phone (810-706-0654) at other times. My email address is [revsuerich@yahoo.com](mailto:revsuerich@yahoo.com).

Of course please call me at Grace on Wednesdays. Our wonderful secretary, Lori Schmidt, will be updated on my scheduled appointments and will continue to be a great resource person.

I am very much looking forward to meeting each of you and sharing ministry together. My plan is to meet with the different ministry groups to listen and learn about who Grace Episcopal Church is and how the Spirit is leading us. With the help of the vestry, I believe we will find some fun ways for me to meet you through small groups in informal settings over the next few months. More will be revealed there!

## VESTRY Meeting Highlights from December 9

Opening prayer was led by Clyde Pearsall and meeting called to order at 6:30 p.m.

Approval made of November 9, 2009 minutes as written.

**Old Business:** Judy informed members that only one date was available for the Poker Palace gaming license and that was during Lapeer Days weekend—so that project was declined. She would like us to get on 2011 list. Stewardship pledge cards were discussed—encourage everyone to get them in. Personnel—regarding the Priest Contract and schedule. Motion to hire Rev. Sue Rich as of 1/1/10 of approximately \$40,000 with open end agreement to be voted on no later than July 1, 2010. Roll call vote taken with unanimous approval.

**New Business:** The annual meeting date set is January 10, 2010. Motion to authorize Lori Schmidt to prepare an application for funding from the Lapeer County Community Foundation to replace kitchen appliances, supported. *Approved.* Discussion regarding snow removal during week—Dick West, Jr. Warden will commit to keeping it cleared. There will be a brunch on the 27th of December after both services so everyone can wish Fr. Boli well and thank him for being with us.

**Priest Comments:** Lori relayed message to Vestry members from Fr. Boli ~ it has been lots of fun—good people that work hard together. He encourages all to worship regularly and ask everyone you know to come—he expects all pledge cards to be turned in. Thank-you for everything and make sure the sign out front is replaced!

**Liaison Reports:** Thrift Shop business is picking up and Food for Families going well but can always use help.

**Columbarium Applications:** Two applications were presented to Vestry for consideration—*Approved.*

Closing prayer by Dick West—meeting adjourned at 7:48 p.m.

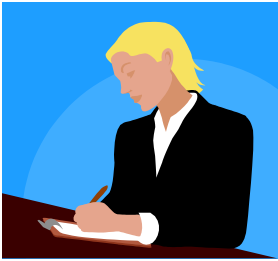

Rev. Sue will be serving Grace as of January, 2010. Your vestry is confident this will be a step forward for Grace.

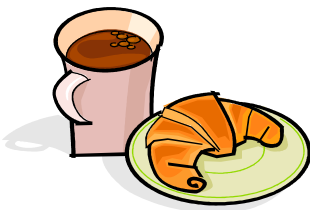

## WHO AM I? What I Believe.

(A report to help Grace church members know each other better.)

I was born in Flint, one of four daughters. We moved to Otter Lake where I graduated from high school. Affiliated with the Episcopal Church in Otter Lake, a year later, I was married by Archbishop Braidwood. A friend in Otter Lake had introduced me to my future husband. At that time I had the luxury of knowing Yung Chou prior to his ordination. Sixteen months into our marriage, I contracted a serious illness and was hospitalized ten months. This threw me out of the work force two years.

After recuperation, we moved to Lapeer where I got a job in the Historic Courthouse. After our first child was born, I returned to the County work at the Courthouse. Ten years later when county social welfare merged with state social service I became a state worker. My office changed to Suncrest Drive. Thirty-five years later I retired from the state of Michigan with scads of experience serving critical human needs.

I lost my husband of twenty-one years to dystrophy. We had two children, a son and a daughter. We now have three wonderful grandchildren.

In community service I have served as state president of the Business and Professional Women's Club, Founding trustee of the Lapeer Community Foundation. Currently, I chair the 4-County Human Development Commission. I participate in a wide variety of Grace Church activities. And in my spare time, I manage a 72 unit large condo.

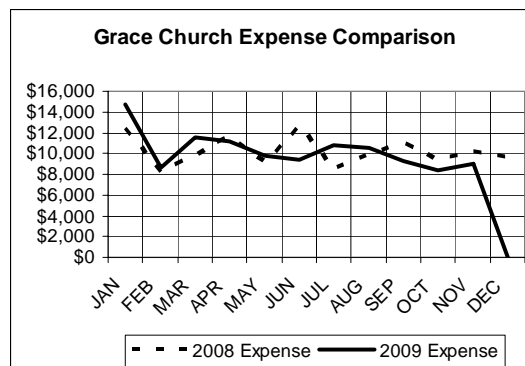
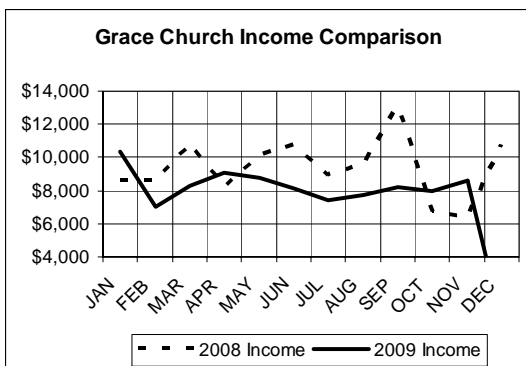

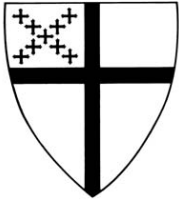
